All G8 Summit members should:

Prioritize the establishment of “Sustainable Global Community” as the first agenda, which benefits not only the national level but also international cooperation. Based on such the prioritization, develop a clear vision for international and national action.

Develop a comprehensive, time-bound and feasible action plan for international as well as internal action, and plan, implement, and monitor the process.

Develop a comprehensive and inter-sectoral education mechanism with the context of the UNDES D while tackling emerging local internal and international sustainable issues such as climate change.

Develop and adopt a mechanism to promote dialogue among stakeholders including citizens, enterprises, and policy makers at regional, national and local levels.
